Joint Program students from under-represented groups (race, ethnicity, gender, sexuality, country of origin) often participate in MIT and WHOI clubs to build supportive communities of those with similar experiences. A small sample of these organizations includes:

MIT

SPXCE (Social Justice Programming & Cross Cultural Engagement Intercultural Center)

Pronounced "space", works to foster a more inclusive, equitable, and affirming MIT campus climate. The SPXCE provides intersectional social justice education, support, community-building, and leadership development. The SPXCE serves as a place where students can feel at home and exist in their wholeness while exploring all of their identities authentically with compassion and care.

Priscilla King Gray Public Service Center

Resource for MIT and local communities to provide programming, guidance, and support to those who are interested in public service.

LBGTQ@MIT

Supports numerous student, employee, and alumni groups as well as other departments and initiatives on campus aiming to foster equity, intersectionality, and the continuum of social justice. The Rainbow Lounge in Walker Memorial (50-250) is a communal space for students' to gather and interact with other LGBTQ members, and doubles as a lending library of LBGT-themed literature and films.

Office of Multicultural Programs

The Office of Multicultural Programs provides support for over 75 multicultural student groups on MIT's campus. From program collaborations, to event planning support and funding, the Office of Multicultural Programs serves as a resource to both student groups and students who seek to foster an inclusive campus environment. These clubs span both the US and the globe! Sponsors the Multicultural Conference (MC²)

Black Student Union

50-105. This lounge hosts all of BSU's events, as well as an event space for other MIT organizations.

Institute Community & Equity Office

This is a more formal group focused on advancing a respectful and caring community that embraces diversity, equity and inclusion and empowers everyone to learn and do their best at MIT.

GW@MIT

A student-led organization dedicated to the personal and professional development of women graduate students at MIT. As a subcommittee of the Graduate Student Council, we provide a unified voice for MIT's graduate women. All members of MIT are welcome to become GWAMIT members and attend events!

Committee on Campus Race & Diversity

The CCRR is charged with fostering better relations among the races, ethnicities and cultures of people at MIT, and with helping the community realize the benefits of its cultural and racial diversity.

Disabilities Services

The objective of the DSO is to ensure that MIT community members receive equal access to all institute programs and services.

International Students Office

Provides services to meet the special needs of MIT international students. Also provides individual advising and group seminars on immigration regulations and services to students and their dependents by assisting them with travel forms.

Inclusion and Diversity in the Joint Program

Latino Cultural Center
